- These are free digital resources that can be used to support learning

What is 'Free'

- Richard Stallman - Four Freedoms
 - Freedom to run / read
 - Freedom to study (access to the source)
 - Freedom to redistribute (sharing)
 - Freedom to improv (modifying)

Types of OERs

- OERs vary according to license types:
 - GNU Free Documentation License
 - Creative Commons
 - David Wiley's ...

Conditions

- From Creative Commons...
 - Attribution
 - Non-Commercial
 - No-Derivatives
 - Share-Alike

- Institutional repositories - OAI, Dspace, the D2L repository
